Command Sergeant Major Luciano entered the U.S. Army in January 1984, attended Basic Training at Fort Jackson, South Carolina, and went on to complete Advanced Individual Training as a Combat Medic at Fort Sam Houston, Texas.

These include Command Sergeant Major, Battalion Senior Medical NCO, Chief Clinical NCO/Sergeant Major, First Sergeant, Operations Sergeant, Senior Clinical NCO, Wardmaster, Platoon Sergeant, Squad Leader, Ambulance Section NCOIC, and Consolidated Troop Medical Clinic NCOIC.
